# THE MONTH OF JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

## The Sacred Heart and Our Spiritual Life

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of the Church's piety for Christ, her Spouse and Lord: it calls for a fundamental attitude of conversion and reparation, of love and gratitude, apostolic commitment and dedication to Christ and his saving work.

Devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus are numerous. Some have been explicitly approved and frequently recommended by the Apostolic See. Among these, mention should be made of the following:



### Personal Consecration

Personal consecration, described by Pius XI as "undoubtedly the principal devotional practice used in relation to the Sacred Heart" (*Miserentissimus redemptor*).



### Family Consecration

Family consecration to the Sacred Heart, in which the family, by virtue of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony already participating in the mystery of the unity and love of Christ for the Church, is dedicated to Christ so that he might reign in the hearts of all its members (*Aliae concessiones*).

Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, approved for the whole Church in 1891, which is evidently biblical in character and to which many indulgences have been attached (*Aliae concessiones*).



### Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart


The act of reparation, a prayer with which the faithful, mindful of the infinite goodness of Christ, implore mercy for the offences committed in so many ways against his Sacred Heart (*Aliae concessiones*).



### The Practice of the First Fridays

The pious practice of the first Fridays of the month which derives from the "great promises" made by Jesus to St. Margaret Mary. At a time when sacramental communion was very rare among the faithful, the first Friday devotion contributed significantly to a renewed use of the Sacraments of Penance and of the Holy Eucharist. In our own times, the devotion to the first Fridays, even if practised correctly, may not always lead to the desired spiritual fruits. Hence, the faithful require constant instruction so that any reduction of the practice to mere credulity is avoided and an active faith encouraged so that the faithful may undertake their commitment to the Gospel correctly in their lives. They should also be reminded of the absolute preeminence of Sunday, the "primordial feast" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*), which should be marked by the full participation of the faithful at the celebration of the Holy Mass.

## Twelve Promises of Jesus to Saint Margaret Mary



In the apparitions to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus gives these twelve promises for those who are devoted to His Sacred Heart.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death.
5. I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection.
9. I will bless the homes where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the power of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced.
12. The all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour.



# JOINING THE MARCH FOR LIFE IN VICTORIA – MAY 12, 2022



It was certainly a challenge to get up early to brave the wet and cloudy weather; but this did not dampen my resolve. As I arrived at our meeting place at the Holy Trinity parking lot, Nicole our organizer was already standing there at 7am, waiting for everyone else and the bus; which took us to the Sacred Heart Parish in Delta for the celebration of the mass, and then to the pier for the ferry ride to Victoria.

People from all over BC and even from the US attended this special occasion. Some were from our Holy Trinity Parish, as well as other parishes from all over the diocese. Priests and nuns, including our very own Sr. Honorine were present, as well as Sr. Angela Marie who had just conducted our most recent CWL retreat. To my pleasant surprise, as we marched to the Parliament building in Victoria, I even bumped into my aunt who I haven't seen for almost 3 long years since the pandemic began. She had come all the way from Seattle to join her friends from Surrey to support the March!

The last time I recall joining the March was in 2019, before the Covid pandemic began. I felt it was great that this March in Victoria was revived once again after three long years! With the current news about the possibility of the US Supreme Court overturning the right to abortion, I felt this certainly was a special time in history to be a part of this special event. During the March, there was a big and beautiful poster of Our Lady of Guadalupe, along with lots of signs and posters for Life that people made themselves; some of which the members of the Knights of Columbus shared with everyone to carry. It was a wonderful sight to also see members of Catholic Women's Leagues in BC, several Pro-Life societies, indigenous groups, students, families young and old, who prayed and marched from Centennial Square to the Parliament building in unity. I personally felt that the friendly smiles and peaceful demeanor of those in support of the March, were in stark contrast to the few I witnessed who had shrieked and screamed their opposition and defiance, in anger and rage.



Among the list several impactful speakers at the steps of the legislature that day was Father Thomas Lynch, president of Priests for Life Canada, who inspired us to continue our efforts, emphasizing that the debate against abortion is not over.

We also heard from Angela Ireland, the Delta Hospice Society president, who shared with us the major victory to keep euthanasia out of the future palliative care facility it hopes to build. She also shared about the victory last April 2nd, where 76 per cent of society members voted to keep the current pro-life board of directors, and pass an amendment to the society's constitution which codified its rejection of euthanasia and medical assistance in dying (MAiD).

After the March, I learned that according to statistics stated by the Campaign for Life Canada, "an estimated 100,000 induced abortions are committed annually in Canada." In regard to MAiD, Statistics Canada stated, "...in 2019, there were 5,425 medically assisted deaths in Canada, accounting for 1.9% of all deaths. In 2020, this increased to 7,383 deaths (2.4% of all deaths in Canada), representing a 36.0% increase in the number of MAiD recipients from 2019 to 2020." My wish is that more of us will be encouraged to openly speak out and make an impact for Life everywhere we go. All in all, I enjoyed the day, made new friends, and considered it one that was certainly well spent.

# FIRST NATIONS 101

## NATIONAL ABORIGINAL DAY & NATIONAL ABORIGINAL HISTORY MONTH

June 21 was chosen as National Aboriginal Day because of the cultural significance of the summer solstice – it is the first day of summer and provides the longest daylight hours of the year. The day is meant to recognize and celebrate First Nations people as part of the wider recognition of First Nations' importance within the fabric of Canada.

### A BRIEF HISTORY OF NATIONAL ABORIGINAL DAY

1982 – National Indian Brotherhood (now called the Assembly of First Nations) calls for the creation of June 21 as national Aboriginal Solidarity Day

1995 – Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples recommends the designation of a National First Peoples Day. The Sacred Assembly, a national conference of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people chaired by Elijah Harper, called for a national holiday to celebrate the contributions of Aboriginal peoples.

1996 – Former Governor General Roméo LeBlanc declares June 21 as National Aboriginal Day

2009 – Parliament of Canada votes to declare June as National Aboriginal History Month

**Thank you, women who are wives!** You irrevocably join your future to that of your husbands, in a relationship of mutual giving, at the service of love and life.


