Dear Sisters in Christ,

The past month has been filled with wonderful highlights that brought meaning to our Lenten journey.

The **40 Days for Life vigil** we had near the BC Women's and Children's hospital was a very humbling experience. On a cold wet Saturday, we braved the weather as we prayed the rosary while we walked up and down the streets, holding up our posters with pro-life slogans. There were a few who showed their support by honking their horns as they passed us by, but we also got our fair share of opposing hand gestures. This made us all the more aware of how important it is to be more visible and active, to ensure our faith serves as a beacon of light to others.

Our weekly **Soup and Silence** reflection moments were very well attended by many of our members and parishioners along with Fr. Lucio and the sisters. The soothing Gregorian chants as well as other instrumental Catholic music provided an environment of peace and serenity to connect with our Lord, after which most of us went up to the Church to join Father Lucio in praying the Stations of the Cross.

Our beautiful **CWL Lenten Retreat** at Westminster Abbey was led by our very own former pastor Fr. James Comey, who shared with us the rich Catholic history, practices and prayers by those of Celtic heritage, their Saints, as well as the many holy places and prayers in Ireland, Scotland, and Wales, where many devout believers professed their love for Christ and all his creation.

This April, being our second month into the Lenten season, brings our focus on the Holy Spirit. To activate the gifts we had received through Confirmation, we must make use of them wisely, lest they remain dormant. The gifts of wisdom, understanding, knowledge, good counsel, courage, piety, and fear of the Lord, all pave the way for us in doing God's will and experiencing the many blessings derived from the fruits they produce in our lives and in those we love. The Holy Spirit empowers us, enlightens our minds and strengthens our will which allows us to do more than we can ever imagine we were capable of. As Christians, we are called to be in the world, but not be of this world. Let us allow the Holy Spirit to work in us and guide us, so that we may be able to stand up against, and not be swept away ourselves, and protect our children from the evil ideologies and practices that oppose God's truth such as euthanasia, abortion, sodomy, transgender mutilation, and many more.

#### APRIL- MONTH IS DEDICATED TO THE HOLY SPIRITY

This month is dedicated to the Holy Spirit. To believe in the Holy Spirit is to profess that the Holy Spirit is one of the persons of the Holy Trinity, consubstantial with the Father and the Son: "with the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified." (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

The Holy Spirit is the Person of Love in the life of God. He is also like a breath, an aspiration of infinite Love, from which we draw the breath of life.

On the day of Pentecost the Divine Spirit communicated such an abundance of life to the whole Church that to symbolize it "there came a sound from heaven, as of a violent wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they (the Apostles) were sitting."

But it is also for us that the Holy Spirit has come, for the group in the Cenacle represented the whole Church. The Holy Spirit came to remain with the Church forever. This is the promise of Jesus Himself. He dwells in the Church permanently and unfailingly, performing in it without ceasing His action of life-giving and sanctification. He establishes the Church infallibly in the truth. It is He Who makes the Church blossom forth with a marvelous supernatural fruitfulness, for He brings to life and full fruition in Virgins, Martyrs, and Confessors those heroic virtues which are one of the marks of true sanctity.

(The Mysteries of the Rosary, Dom Columba Marmion, O.S.B.)

One of the most widely used hymns in the Church, Veni, Creator Spiritus, is attributed to Rabanus Maurus; (776–856). It is used at Vespers, Pentecost, Dedication of a Church, Confirmation, and Holy Orders and whenever the Holy Spirit is solemnly invoked. A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who recite it. A plenary indulgence is granted if it is recited on January 1st or on the feast of Pentecost.

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest, and in our souls take up Thy rest; come with Thy grace and heavenly aid to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

O comforter, to Thee we cry, O heavenly gift of God Most High, O fount of life and fire of love, and sweet anointing from above.

Thou in Thy sevenfold gifts are known; Thou, finger of God's hand we own; Thou, promise of the Father, Thou Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Kindle our sense from above, and make our hearts o'erflow with love; with patience firm and virtue high the weakness of our flesh supply.

Far from us drive the foe we dread, and grant us Thy peace instead; so shall we not, with Thee for guide, turn from the path of life aside.

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow the Father and the Son to know; and Thee, through endless times confessed, of both the eternal Spirit blest.

Now to the Father and the Son, Who rose from death, be glory given, with Thou, O Holy Comforter, henceforth by all in earth and heaven. Amen.

Some of you may remember the project undertaken by the National CWL in April 2019 in anticipation of the 100th anniversary of the league in 2020. The goal was to donate 2019 packages to women's shelters (for women & children who seek refuge from abuse). Donations included toiletries as well as pj's, slippers and diapers.

#### MEET OUR COMMUNITY

Do you know ANNA CHUTKA?

Anna is a "prairie girl" at heart, having been born in southern Saskatchewan over 99 years ago! She was raised in a rural community, the second of six children, three girls and three boys. Canadian rural family life for a girl in the 1920's pretty much insured a talent and love for Anna's favourite pass-times, drawing and painting, sewing, baking, gardening and lots of reading. Her favourite reading material is religious and health related.



As a child Anna recalls going to her local parish church for Catechism day camp for a week each summer. That was where she learned most about her faith and where she developed her love for God and His Church. Anna met her husband of 58 years in Saskatoon through her parish priest. They were married in her groom's home parish in Winnipeg. The couple moved to North Vancouver in the 1950's, first attending St. Edmund's parish, close to their Keith Road home. Anna became a member of the St. Edmund's Women's Auxiliary before moving to her present home and transferring to Holy Trinity parish. She joined the Holy Trinity Women's Auxiliary in the 1960's and, later, the Holy Trinity CWL. Four of Anna's five children (four sons and one daughter) went through Holy Trinity Elementary school, while the eldest transferred from St. Edmund's School just for grade seven.

Anna has many happy memories of Holy Trinity parish community life. She recalls sewing the drapes for the church hall, making sandwiches for the homeless, baking for funeral receptions, working on food and clothing drives and collecting furnishings and diapers for babies. A vivid memory is of the big white pails which some of the men of the parish collected from local restaurants. The pails were nearly empty, but some of the food would be left inside. The ladies would scrape out the remaining food (peanut butter or jam or beans, etc.) and repackage it to be distributed to the needy.

Anna has a strong faith and a deep devotion to the rosary and St. Theresa of the Child Jesus, to whom she was introduced by the Sisters at St. Edmund's. She believes that helping others is a great motivation for belonging, developing community and the making of life-long friendships. Anna says:

"Kindness and hospitality are so important.

We are meant to live in community, reaching out to one another.

Getting old is not easy, but friends and family mean so much.

My advice is to be open to helping others, and sometimes letting them help you."
