THE MONTH OF MAY IS DEDICATED TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

In our observance of the Marian month we should take into account the season of the Liturgical Year which largely corresponds with the fifty days of Easter. Our pious exercises could emphasize Our Lady's participation in the Paschal mystery and in Pentecost with which the Church begins. The pious exercises connected with the month of May can easily highlight the earthly role played by the glorified Queen of Heaven, here and now, in the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

The following practices which are recommended by the Magisterium are offered as suggestions for honoring Our Lady during Her month.

The Regina Coeli

The ecclesial community addresses this antiphon to Mary for the Resurrection of her Son. It adverts to, and depends on, the invitation to joy addressed by Gabriel to the Lord's humble servant who was called to become the Mother of the saving Messiah.

The Rosary

Also called the Psalter of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Rosary is one of the most excellent prayers to the Mother of God. Thus, "the Roman Pontiffs have repeatedly exhorted the faithful to the frequent recitation of this biblically inspired prayer which is centered on contemplation of the salvific events of Christ's life, and their close association with the Virgin Mother."

Litanies of the Blessed Virgin Mary

These consist of a long series of invocations to Our Lady, which follow in a uniform rhythm, thereby creating a stream of prayer characterized by insistent praise and supplication.

Consecration and Entrustment to Mary

The Roman Pontiffs have frequently expressed appreciation for the pious practice of "consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary" and the formulas publicly used by them are well known.

Louis Grignon de Montfort is one of the great masters of the spirituality underlying the act of "consecration to Mary". He "proposed to the faithful consecration to Jesus through Mary, as an effective way of living out their baptismal commitment."

The Brown Scapular and other Scapulars

The scapular is an external sign of the filial relationship established between the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel, and the faithful who entrust themselves totally to her protection, who have recourse to her maternal intercession, who are mindful of the primacy of the spiritual life and the need for prayer.

Medals

These are witnesses of faith and a sign of veneration of the Holy Mother of God, as well as of trust in her maternal protection.

The Church blesses such objects of Marian devotion in the belief that "they help to remind the faithful of the love of God, and to increase trust in the Blessed Virgin Mary."

The "Akathistos" Hymn

In the Byzantine tradition, one of the oldest and most revered expressions of Marian devotion is the hymn of the "Akathistos" — meaning the hymn sung while standing. It is a literary and theological masterpiece, encapsulating in the form of a prayer, the universally held Marian belief of the primitive Church.

MEET OUR COMMUNITY: DAISY GAGNE TURNS 100 YEARS YOUNG



Do you know Daisy Gagné:

Longtime CWL Member Daisy Gagné celebrated her 100th birthday on April 21, 2023 with her 7 daughters and 3 generations of extended family. She was raised in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, by devout, but broadminded Protestant parents who respected other religious denominations and felt that each person should choose the religion that felt right to them. Daisy chose Catholicism, and married her husband Art in St Joseph's Roman Catholic Church on August 5, 1945. After a post-war move to the west coast, the couple settled in North Vancouver and joined Holy Trinity parish, where their children were among the first students of the new Catholic elementary school.

Daisy's old scrapbook includes full page Province newspaper coverage of a 1949 "Rally for Family Prayer" attended by 35,000 people. Whether as a young mother or a retiree, Daisy was very involved in the parish, helping to organize bazaars, prayer vigils, family festivals, luncheons and post-mass coffee gatherings.

She was a member of the H.T. 'Ladies' Auxilliary' and its successor the C.W.L. for over 60 years, and even served a term as President in 1988-1989. She and Art were also extremely active in the North Shore Pro-Life group and in Marriage Encounter.

Daisy says "Although age and arthritis mean I can no longer attend CWL functions, I value the many friends I've made there. Thanks for the great memories, the delightful card, the beautiful birthday flowers, and for your thoughtful efforts to keep me connected with parish life."



MOTHER'S DAY

In Canada, Mother's Day is the third most popular holiday after Christmas and Valentine's Day. The celebration is very similar to the celebration in the United States. In Canada, Mother's Day is not a public holiday.

Mother's Day is celebrated across the world, in more than 50 countries, though not all countries celebrate it on the same day.

Early History

Arguably, the tradition of a day to celebrate mothers can be traced back to the times of the ancient Greeks, who held festivities to honour Rhea, the mother of the gods.

Early Christians celebrated the fourth Sunday of Lent as a Mother's festival to honour Mary, the mother of Christ. In the UK, the tradition of Mother's Day is now very similar to its American counterpart, but its origins are different, as the day commemorates returning to your mother church on the fourth Sunday in Lent.

The English colonists who settled in America discontinued the tradition of Mothering Sunday, as presumably, it would have been a bit of a trip to return to their mother church for the day.

For mothers who grieve and mourn, especially those who have lost a child before birth:

that they find consolation in God's promise of life; We pray to the Lord.
