The Blessed Virgin Mary grants seven graces to the souls who honor her daily by saying seven Hail Mary's and meditating on her tears and dolors (sorrows).


The devotion was passed on by St. Bridget.


For people living on the margins

Core Purpose

EXPLANATION OF EMBER DAYS

Three days set apart for fasting, abstinence, and prayer during each of the four seasons of the year. They were the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday after St. Lucy (or Lucia, d. 304) (December 13), the First Sunday of Lent, Pentecost, and the feast of the Holy Cross (September 14).

Since the revision of the Roman calendar in 1969, Ember Days are to be observed at the discretion of the National Conference of Bishops. Moreover, their observance may be extended beyond three days and even repeated during the year. Possibly occasioned by the agricultural feasts of ancient Rome, they came to be observed by Christians for the sanctification of the different seasons of the year, and for obtaining God's blessing on the clergy to be ordained during the Embertides. (Etym. Anglo-Saxon oemerge, ashes.)

Resolved, that national council of The Catholic Women's League of Canada in 103rd national annual meeting of members assembled, urge the federal government to establish new programs and to expand established subsidies aimed at reducing textile waste in Canada.

POSITION PAPERS 2023

Abortion - In accordance with Catholic church teachings, respects human life from conception to natural death. As such, any procedures that cause the intentional killing of unborn human beings at any stage of development are gravely wrong. • The League commits to advocating for a society where all human life is respected and protected through government legislation and community services that support pregnant women and families, such as those living in poverty, experiencing violence and living in adverse situations.

Euthanasia and Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID)- In accordance with the Catholic church teachings, respects human life from conception to natural death. Any deliberate killing of another human being by euthanasia/MAiD is gravely wrong, even when done out of compassion when someone is dying or there is concern about their quality of life. The League: • affirms its support for allowing a person to die a natural death with support from palliative care. • believes that each member of society is unique, including the underprivileged, disabled, sick or infirm, whose dignity needs to be honoured, respected and protected. • recognizes that Canadian legislation is on a slippery slope of becoming more accepting and desensitized about euthanasia, making it available to the vulnerable populations that were protected in the initial legislation. Internationally, Canada is becoming recognized as being one of the most liberal countries regarding MAiD legislation and its application. • urges all Canadians to reflect deeply on the consequences and dangers of giving individuals the right to take the life of another human being.

Health Research - The Catholic Women's League of Canada believes health research must always be carried out ethically, recognizing the inherent worth of all human beings and the respect and consideration that each person is due. The League: • looks to the Vatican and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops for direction regarding fundamental moral criteria. • recognizes that funding for health research will always be a concern as new illnesses and health conditions emerge, and funding sources, both government and private, must take moral issues into consideration.

Matrimony and Same-sex Unions - The Catholic Women's League of Canada is committed to recognizing the bond of marriage as a matrimonial covenant between one man and one woman to the exclusion of all others and for showing respect and love for the dignity of partners in same-sex unions, their families and their children. • The League is committed to strengthening and protecting matrimony as an institution fundamental to the growth and prosperity of civilization and calls for marriage to be defined in Canadian law as between one woman and man to the exclusion of all others

Reproductive and Genetic Technologies - The Catholic Women's League of Canada respects human life, believing life and personhood begin at conception until natural death. Reproductive and genetic technologies must be consistent with these values, respecting the dignity and value of human life and the unitive and procreative aspect of matrimony. • Many reproductive and genetic technologies benefit humankind. However, there are concerns about human embryo cloning, some infertility interventions, the marketing of fetal tissue and all zygote/embryo research. • The League looks to the Vatican and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops for direction regarding fundamental moral criteria.

The Use of Stem Cells for Research Purposes -In accordance with Catholic church teachings, respects the gift of human life from conception to natural death. Using human stem cells in research can positively and significantly impact medical and pharmacological treatments of severe diseases. However, there must be protection from using human embryonic stem cells in research and therapies where the embryo is destroyed. • The League will follow the direction of the Vatican and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) during times when vaccination is the only solution to the loss of life, the choosing of vaccines not derived from human embryonic stem cells is impossible, and decisions must be made for the greater good of the population.

Truth and Reconciliation - The Catholic Women's League of Canada commits to "walking together" with Indigenous peoples of Canada, begun by Pope Francis, and providing members with resources and opportunities to advance the cause of truth and reconciliation. • In accordance with church teachings, the League commits to promoting awareness and understanding of Indigenous peoples' histories, spiritualities, cultures, languages, traditions, rights and concerns and to becoming more informed about the violation of their dignity and human rights by governments, churches, society and individuals. • The League recognizes that reconciliation is a process of healing relationships, requiring changed hearts and attitudes through encounter and dialogue, education, truth sharing, apology and commemoration, and acknowledgement and redress of past harms. The Catechism of the Catholic Church instructs that freedom makes people responsible for their actions.
