### THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER IS DEDICATED TO THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

### **Solemnity of All Saints**

The Church celebrates all the saints: canonized or beatified, and the multitude of those who are in heaven enjoying the beatific vision that are only known to God. During the early centuries the Saints venerated by the Church were all martyrs. Later the pope set November 1 as the day for commemorating all the Saints. We all have this "universal call to holiness." What must we to do in order to join the company of the saints in heaven? We "must follow in His footsteps and conform [our]selves to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. [We] must devote [our] selves with all [our] being to the glory of God and the service of [our] neighbor. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history" (Lumen Gentium, 40).

"This perfect life with the Most Holy Trinity—this communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed—is called "heaven." Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness" (CCC 1024).

Remember to pray for the <u>Faithful Departed</u> from November I to the 8th.

# Commemoration of the All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)

The Church, after celebrating the feast of All Saints, praying for all who, in the purifying suffering of Purgatory, await the day they will join in heavenly glory. The celebration of the Mass, which re-presents the Sacrifice of Christ on Calvary, has always been the principal means by which the Church fulfills the great responsibility of charity toward the dead. Death cannot break the bonds of the Body of Christ. —Daily Roman Missal

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

"The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned" (CCC 1030-1031).

Even when November 2 falls on a Sunday, the Mass celebrated is that from the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.

### **OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE**

"Though already present in his Church, Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled "with power and great glory" by the King's return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover. Until everything is subject to him, 'until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in her sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass, and she herself takes her place among the creatures which groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God.' That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ's return by saying to him: Marana tha! 'Our Lord, come!" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 671)

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, formerly referred to as "Christ the King," was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

### The titles for Christ's royalty over men

- 1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him";
- 2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession;
- 3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy";
- 4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

#### The qualities of Christ's kingdom

- 1) Supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings;
- 2) Universal, extending to all nations and to all places;
- 3) Eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever";
- 4) Spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world."

# LEGISLATION NEWS: CANADIAN PARLIAMENT DEFEATS BILL TO STOP EUTHANIZING MENTALLY ILL PATIENTS

At our Vancouver Diocesan General Meeting, Erin Merth, Diocesan Executive for Resolutions sadly shared that this bill, known as Bill C-314, the Mental Health Protection Act, which was sponsored by the Hon. Ed Fast (CPC), was narrowly defeated by a vote of 167 to 150 at second reading in parliament on Wednesday October 18, 2023.

This bill is to protect people who are living with mental illness from medical assistance in dying (euthanasia). The latest Angus Reid Institute survey indicated that only 28% of Canadians support euthanasia for mental illness while 82% of Canadians stated that mental health care should be improved before euthanasia for mental illness is considered.

This however is not a "settled" issue. We will not be silent in the face of killing. **Make your voice heard and help us advocate by contacting your MP.**
