MESSAGE FROM HT CWL PRESIDENT: NINA G. CARPIO

THE MONTH OF APRIL IS DEDICATED TI HE HOLY SPIRIT

To believe in the Holy Spirit is to profess that the Holy Spirit is one of the persons of the Holy Trinity, consubstantial with the Father and the Son: "with the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified." (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

The Holy Spirit is the Person of Love in the life of God. He is also like a breath, an aspiration of infinite Love, from which we draw the breath of life.

"Holy Spirit" is the proper name of the one whom we adore and glorify with the Father and the Son. The Church has received this name from the Lord and professes it in the Baptism of her new children.

The term "Spirit" translates the Hebrew word ruah, which in its primary sense, means breath, air, wind. Jesus indeed uses the sensory image of the wind to suggest to Nicodemus the transcendent newness of him who is personally God's breath, the divine Spirit. On the other hand, "Spirit" and "Holy" are divine attributes common to the three divine persons. By joining the two terms, Scripture, liturgy, and theological language designate the inexpressible person of the Holy Spirit, without any possible equivocation with other uses of the terms "spirit" and "holy."

Veni, Creator Spiritus (Come Holy Spirit, Creator Blest)

One of the most widely used hymns in the Church, Veni, Creator Spiritus, is attributed to Rabanus Maurus; (776-856). It is used at Vespers, Pentecost, Dedication of a Church, Confirmation, and Holy Orders and whenever the Holy Spirit is solemnly invoked. A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who recite it. A plenary indulgence is granted if it is recited on January 1st or on the feast of Pentecost.

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest, and in our souls take up Thy rest; come with Thy grace and heavenly aid to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

O comforter, to Thee we cry, O heavenly gift of God Most High, O fount of life and fire of love, and sweet anointing from above.

Thou in Thy sevenfold gifts are known; Thou, finger of God's hand we own; Thou, promise of the Father, Thou Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Kindle our sense from above, and make our hearts o'erflow with love; with patience firm and virtue high the weakness of our flesh supply.

Far from us drive the foe we dread, and grant us Thy peace instead; so shall we not, with Thee for guide, turn from the path of life aside.

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow the Father and the Son to know; and Thee, through endless times confessed, of both the eternal Spirit blest.

Now to the Father and the Son, Who rose from death, be glory given, with Thou, O Holy Comforter, henceforth by all in earth and heaven. Amen.

Secretary – will report to National, Provincial and Diocesan CWL the new list of Executive Officers for our council and will report and retain minutes of all Executive and General meetings.

b. LEGISLATION: Bill C-63 - Online Harms Act

We have been urged to write to our Members of Parliament to vote against this legislation. If passed, this could mean fines of up to \$50,000, payments of up to \$20,000 to "offended" parties, or imprisonment of individuals who post internet messages, which the complainants may assert to cause fear, due to what they consider in their opinion to be hateful, violent or discriminatory speech.

Samantha Strudwick, Vancouver Diocesan Executive for Legislation shared about the concern over this bill during our last CWL Vancouver Diocesan Meeting on March 23rd. The bill's First Reading was completed in February 2024; and the Second Reading, during which Parliamentarians will have their first opportunity to speak on the Bill in the House of Commons, is expected to begin soon.

The bill was introduced by the federal government to promote online safety of persons in Canada, which may have good intentions behind some of its provisions. However, one of the major concerns discussed was that there is great risk if opinions shared on the internet by those who support certain advocacies such as pro-life issues against abortion or euthanasia as an example, may also be construed as hate speech. Those with opposing views can merely state that they fear that the messages posted could promote hatred; and if a judge believes there are "reasonable grounds" to justify the fear, this would bring about censorship and prosecution of those accused.

Bill C-63 targets seven categories of "harmful content":

- · Intimate content communicated without consent.
- · Content that sexually victimizes a child or revictimizes a survivor.
- Content that induces a child to harm themselves.
- · Content used to bully a child.
- · Content that foments hatred.
- · Content that incites violence.
- · Content that incites violent extremism or terrorism.

NEW - RECIPES

Kelly's Ukrainian Borsch Recipe

Ingredients

Pour 6 or 7 cups of vegetable broth into a Dutch oven. Add--

1 cup grated carrots
2 cups grated beets
2 cups shredded cabbage
1/2 cup thinly sliced celery
1 cup frozen peas (or lima beans or edamame)
1 tbsp chopped fresh dill
1 medium onion, chopped fine
1 tsp salt

Instructions

Cook above vegetables for 30 mins. Meanwhile chop half of a medium onion and fry in 2 tbsp margarine or butter until clear. Add 2 tbsp flour and stir until a smooth paste is formed. Cool then add 1 can tomato soup and 1 soup can of water. Stir well and add this to the cooked vegetables. Salt and pepper to taste. Simmer about 10 minutes for flavours to blend. Serve with dollop of sour cream if desired.

**I boil about 3 or 4 medium sized beets prior to soup making so skin slips off easily. Cool and then grate. You can also add cubed new potatoes to the initial vegetable simmer for a chunkier soup. Recipe is easily doubled.


This is a wonderful opportunity for those living on the North Shore, and all others, to witness to the value of human life from conception to its natural end.
